Item 4. I will, bequeath and devise to my husband John R. Stephens with whom I have lived Thirty five years, all my other property, or rights, of whatever kind, be it money, personal property or land to be his absolutely, and to be disposed of at his pleasure.

Item 5. I hereby constitute and appoint my husband John R. Stephens Executor of this my last will and testament. This the 21st day of April 1900.
